PROFILE

Cyanco Company, LLC manufactures and markets chemicals products. The company produces solid to liquid systems, cyanide control systems, peroxide assisted leaches, analyzers, and sodium cyanide for the gold mining industry. The company started producing liquid sodium cyanide in 1990 at a single plant in Winnemucca, Nevada. The original plant was designed to produce 28 million pounds of product annually. A second plant came online in 1997 and investments have been made in both plants over the years to debottleneck, implement improvements and enhancements and increase production. Today, the two plants have production capacity of over 240 million pounds annually. In early 2009, the company's Nevada Operations achieved the one billion pound production milestone, which represents approximately 60,000 loads of product delivered to mining customers in Nevada and the surrounding states. Cyanco Company, LLC prides itself on its commitment to safety, becoming one of the original signatories to the International Cyanide Management Code (ICMC). All of Cyanco's facilities and supply chains are ICMC certified. Cyanco, as the largest global producer of sodium cyanide, has been a critical supplier to the gold and silver mining industry for nearly three decades. Every gold and silver mine in Nevada relies on frequent shipments from our facility in Winnemucca to produce their precious metals. Headquartered in Pearland, TX, Cyanco has manufacturing facilities in Nevada and Texas serving customers in North America, Latin America, and Africa.

In order to increase our production of solid sodium cyanide for global markets, Cyanco is currently deciding between investing in adding solids capacity at our Winnemucca facility (which currently only produces sodium cyanide in a solution form), or expanding our current solid sodium cyanide facility in Alvin, Texas. The new facility will have an annual production capacity of 60 million pounds, and the product will be destined almost exclusively for mines outside of the continental US. Cyanco intends to invest over \$42 million in this project and is comparing development incentives in order to determine which location will produce the highest rate of return on our capital investment. The target date for groundbreaking is September 2018, and the estimated completion date is October 2019. We have already permitted the option in Texas and our Nevada permit application in currently under review by the NDEP.

Our Winnemucca facility currently employs 40 fulltime permanent workers. Were we to build in Winnemucca, the proposed expansion would add 20 fulltime permanent jobs, plus 62 temporary employees during engineering, design, and construction. Wages for these permanent jobs would average \$62,500 for production workers, \$78,000 for maintenance workers, and \$115,000 for professional and engineers.

Cyanco has been a vital part of the community in Winnemucca and a mission critical enabler of Nevada's mining industry for nearly 30 years. We are excited about the market opportunities presented by this project and the advantages that expanding the facility in Winnemucca could offer both to Cyanco and to the Nevada economy. We look forward to your creative offerings which could make a decision to invest in Nevada rather than Texas obvious.
