United Parcel Service, Inc.'s plans are to expand and automate its local sort and distribution hub ("Hub") operation at 355 Vista Blvd, Sparks NV 89437. This expansion of the Sparks operations will improve the region's connectivity within UPS's worldwide package and distribution network and better align it with UPS's other activities such as freight and distribution logistics, ground and ocean freight transportation services, customs brokerage, insurance and financing activities. This initiative will be a significant expansion of the Sparks Hub; in operation since 1990. To help mitigate the financial risks of this project and to partner with the local community, UPS seeks operating tax abatements and/or grants from NV GOED.

The commercial and home delivery business is experiencing rapid growth. Speed and certainty are key customer requirements, as is cost. Sparks expansion brings with it financial risks within this rapidly evolving competitive business environment. Cost mitigating incentives become a necessity and help the community to receive a high-quality UPS operation. The Sparks Hub currently occupies approximately 167,313 square feet on 62 acres. In January of 2022, based on the capacity needs of the Reno planning area a project was approved for a new 10K / 120 car UPS package center. This location and area are meaningful for future growth of UPS and the UPS workforce. With adjusted volume plans for the outer years, we have begun the analysis to determine what future projects we should Hold, Defer or Cancel. When evaluating these projects to continue or cancel, one of the components is the ROI for the project. Potential Tax incentives weight heavily on this calculation, and in general where there is ROI improvement from tax incentives it makes that project much more attractive to complete than projects in other states that do not have the same incentives or return.
