- Concerning educational attainment, **4.6% of Pershing County, NV residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (16.5% below the national average), and **6.2% hold an Associate's Degree** (2.7% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2023 are Metal Ore Mining, Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals, and Education and Hospitals (Local Government).




Jan 2024 Labor Force Breakdown






Unemployment by Gender



Unemployment by Ethnicity








Pershing County, NV had a January 2024 unemployment rate of 5.58%, increasing from 4.12% 5 years before.




Millennials

Pershing County, NV has 487 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 338.




Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is about average in Pershing County, NV. The national average for an area this size is 1,937 people 55 or older, while there are 2,048 here.















Top Industry Employment Concentration







Top Industry GRP









Median Hourly Earnings


