

## REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS: 2025-2029 NEVADA CONSOLIDATED PLANS & A.I.

The State of Nevada is accepting written technical and cost proposals from consultants to prepare the 2025-2029 Consolidated Plan (Con Plan) and/or Analysis of Impediments (AI) to Fair Housing Choice. Proposals may be submitted for the Con Plan the AI or both. The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUS) requires the State of Nevada Non-Entitlement Program to develop a Consolidated Plan to secure funding for HUD's four formula grant programs: Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME, Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), Housing for People with AIDS/HIV (HOPWA) and for the Housing Trust Fund (HTF). The state is required to certify that it will affirmatively further fair housing as outlined in the AI.

Proposals are due on Friday, August 16, 2024, 5:00 p.m. (PDT). The completed Con Plan and AI are due May 16<sup>th</sup>, 2025. The RFP can be accessed at the following web addresses:
