**Determination of Unemployment Status in Each County**

Board Resolution 2015-1230 states that “for the purpose of determining the rate of unemployment in a county said rate of unemployment shall be the county-level, 12-month unemployment rate as established by the Research and Analysis Division of the Nevada Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation (“DETR”).”

Below are the updated rates through June 2025.
